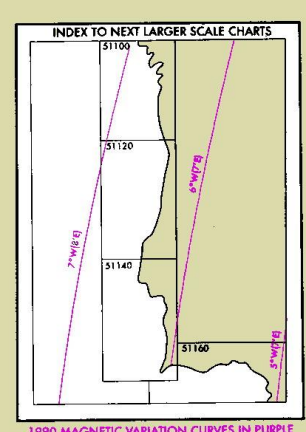
Soundings on this chart are corrected for sound velocity.
